<u>Public Announcement on setting emission reduction Targets</u>

Reliance Jio Infocomm Ltd has had its emissions reduction targets approved by the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi) as consistent with levels required to meet the goals of the Paris agreement.

The SBTi has assessed Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited's submission against the SBTi's Criteria v4.2 and after careful review has approved the targets, as follows:

Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited join the SBTi campaign at 1.5°C' and adopted targets to significantly reduce its carbon footprint and emissions from its network operations. With this, Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited joins the league of leading global corporations who have committed to the 1.5°C pathway outlined by the SBTi - a partnership between CDP, the United Nations Global Compact, World Resources Institute (WRI) and the World-Wide Fund for Nature (WWF).

- 1. Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited commits to reduce absolute scope 1 and scope 2 GHG emissions 76% by FY2028 from FY2020 base year.
- 2. Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited commits to increase annual sourcing of renewable electricity from 1.19% in FY2020 to 100% by FY2029 and to continue sourcing 100% renewable electricity through FY2030.
- 3. Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited commits to reduce absolute scope 3 GHG emissions from purchased goods and services, capital goods, fuel and energy related activities, upstream transportation and distribution, waste generated in operations, business travel, and upstream leased assets 66.5% by FY2028 from FY2020 base year.

Reliance Jio has also been a forerunner when it comes to decarbonising its operation. Reliance Jio Infocomm Limited (RJIL) has received its highest 'A-' rating in CDP's 2021 global rating of companies on the way it manages its environmental impacts. Jio is the only telecom and digital services firm in India to receive a leadership rating on CDP's Global Environment Impact.
